

JOSE FIGUEROA

Violinist

JOSE FIGUEROA, distinguished Puerto Rican violinist, received his first musical training as a child from his mother and father, both accomplished musicians. When he was eight years old he was "discovered" by the famed virtuoso, Henri Ern, who became so interested in the boy's great ability that he remained in Puerto Rico to teach him. Later, as a pupil at the Madrid Conservatory, Figueroa won the coveted Sarasate Prize, and played a command performance for King Alphonso XIII. In Paris, his playing won the praise of Jacques Thibaud, Alfred Cortot, Nadia Boulanger and Georges Enesco. He became an instructor at the Ecole Normale, and acted as Concert Master of the great and well-remembered Cortot's Chamber Music Orchestra. He has been heard in concert throughout Europe, the West Indies, Cuba and Mexico, and has given two New York recitals. His brother, an established concert pianist, accompanies him in this recital.
