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Bishari Camp on the Mokattam Hills. The Bishari's are natives of Upper Egypt, and one of their Villages is close to Aswan. They dress their hair in a peculiar fashion, the men wear it long and friezed out at the top and sides of the head and the women in innumerable little plaits. The Government officials employ these Bishari people when engaged in survey work as they are wonderful trackers and have very good riding camels.
