Relief measures to be followed by Musicians Emergency Aid as set forth in a statement prepared by Mr. Damrosch include: "the granting of loans to musicians who require temporary assistance; the disbursement of relief for musicians in immediate need of necessities; and the administration of a musical placement bureau, similar to and in cooperation with the work bureau operated by the Emergency Unemployment Relief Committee, but providing engagements of a musical nature for worthy artists."

"Unlike large public welfare agencies which deal impersonally with large groups of people, the Musicians Emergency Aid will assist individuals known personally in many instances to members of the Committee. In other cases, trained welfare workers will study carefully the histories and circumstances of applicants, but kindly and confidential treatment will be accorded to all."
